

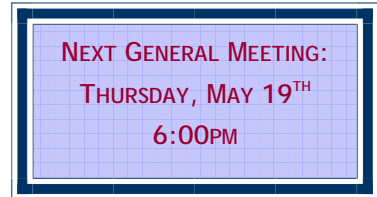

#### 50% OFF INITIATION FEES DURING “EVERY MEMBER GET A MEMBER” CAMPAIGN

There is good news on the membership front. With recent approval from the TYC board, we are engaging in a new member campaign dubbed the “Every Member Get a Member” campaign. Commencing May 1<sup>st</sup> all initiation fees will be reduced by 50% for a period of 90 days ending July 31<sup>st</sup>. In addition, new racers can deduct racing fees during 2011 and 2012 – up to \$100. And finally, new members who belong to another yacht club will be credited with two months TYC dues in the first year of membership. This is a great time to bring your friends into our club at very attractive prices.

An “open house” is planned for the evening of **Friday, May 20<sup>th</sup>** for prospective members. In early May each TYC member will be mailed two copies of an invitation to the open house along with a revised membership application showing the discounted initiation fees. 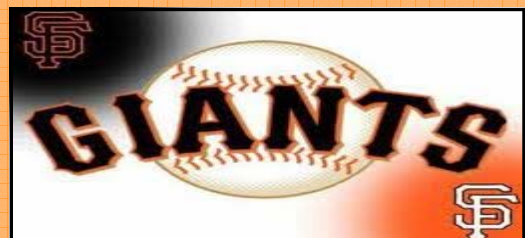

**Session 1 – July 9, 16, 23**

Program instruction will be based on U.S. Sailing curriculum. Sessions are *limited to ten kids between the ages of 8-13*. Sign-ups are on a first come, first served basis.

### The goal is to have fun and become comfortable on the water.

The focus is basic sailing skills, enabling a child to feel confident sailing a single-handed dinghy. Concepts include: capsize recovery, steering, sail trim, upwind/downwind sailing and safety. ## TYC: A Boat/US Cooperating Group — GA84410Y

Did you know that TYC is a Boat/US cooperating group? Each year we renew our cooperating group agreement with Boat/US, which gives TYC members who join or renew their membership in this great organization a 50% discount off the normal yearly membership. Yes, that is only \$15.00/year!

Are you a member of Boat/US? Make sure you are billed at the group rate of \$15.00. If not, put our cooperating group number – **GA84410Y** – on your renewal notice and pay the reduced group dues. Keep this number handy until you've renewed your membership. It will also be posted at the club.

Not a member of Boat/US? Want to learn more about the benefits of membership? Visit their website, [www.boatus.com](http://www.boatus.com).

Briefly, membership in Boat/US makes available a broad range of services including marina and fuel discounts, low-cost boat insurance, on-the-water towing services, EPIRB rentals and a "kids" life jacket loaner program. They have an excellent bimonthly magazine, which alone is worth the \$15.00 annual dues. Their website provides excellent information on boating safety, buying and selling a boat, a boat recall registry and a consumer protection bureau.

Possibly one of the most important reasons for belonging to Boat/US is to support their efforts as an effective lobby representing boater interests at the federal level. In 2008 they successfully worked with many other boating groups including Recreational Boaters of California (RBOC) to ensure the passage of the Clean Boating Act of 2008, which provided that recreational vessels are not required to have "**operational discharge permits**" under the federal Clean Water Act. However, the act mandated that the EPA analyze recreational boat discharges and eventually **mandate "Management Practices" for recreational boaters**. Boat/US is now working with the EPA to ensure those mandated rules are practical, realistic and economical.
